November is indeed here – ushering in the season of gratitude and stirring a reflective energy that inspires us to cherish each moment of dwindling daylight and the soothing cool breeze! It's the month of heartwarming reunions, golden landscapes, and the anticipation of winter's embrace. Morgan H Nichols once said, "Let this be the November you always remember. The November you chose to believe there was more to your future than you were able to see. The November where you learned to trust that after everything happened, in time, you would grow in the courage to open up again. And you could look forward to these new unknowns, believing that no matter what would happen, you would still grow. Update on the partnership between Sgt David G Ledgerwood Post 255 and the City of Deltona – We received the Master Land Development Agreement and the Land Lease Contract from the city attorneys. We had a meeting with our attorney, Mark Watts, on Monday, October 27th, to discuss these two documents for clarification, additions and/or corrections. In addition, we have had two meetings with Alex Silva, who represents Architecture 101, to develop a plan, moving forward, along with a power point and video (in 3D) of the end product of our dream American Legion Post 255 Family Center. This power point and video will be a dynamic tool in the presentations we will use to inform the City of Deltona and the community of our intentions, what folks can expect, and it will be a huge asset in our efforts to raise funds for construction costs. There will be more to come on this subject. Stay tuned!

There are some important days to remember during the month of November besides our Post and Auxiliary meetings on November 1st. Nov 6-16th we will be at the Volusia County Fair, with our 50/50 raffle tickets (grand prize \$2500 if we distribute all 1000 tickets); Nov 8th is the Dist 17 Officers Meeting at Post 361; Nov 11th we will be hosting the Veterans Day Ceremony at Deltona Veterans Memorial Park, with a free picnic after the ceremony. Nov 21-23 members should be attending the Dept of Florida Annual Conference at Caribe Royal in Orlando. Other activities and events will be discussed at our November general meeting. Hope to see you there.

We have been picking apart Psalm 91 over the past few months. There always seems to be so much information to consider in so few words. That's why at times we need to move slowly through the Scriptures. We have worked up to Psalm 91:5-6 and here we are still in these two verses.

"You will not be afraid of...the destruction that lays waste at noon". – Psalm 91:5-6

Here we find the fourth category of evil. It is destruction. Destruction takes in the evils over which mankind has no control- those things the world ignorantly calls acts of God: tornadoes, floods, hail, hurricanes, and fire. Yet God very plainly tells us we are not to fear destruction. These natural disasters are NOT from God.

In Mark 4:39m Jesus rebuked the storm and it became perfectly calm. This demonstrates that God is not the author of such things, because Jesus would never have contradicted His Father by rebuking something sent by Him.

There is no place in the world you can go and be safe from every destruction-every natural disaster. But no matter where you are in the world, God says to run to is shelter where you will not be afraid of the destruction...it will not approach you!

Every evil known to man will fall into one of these four categories we have named in verses 5 and 6: terror, arrows, pestilence, or destruction. The amazing thing is God has offered us deliverance from them all.

God tells us in His Word these things will not approach us if we dwell in His shelter and abide in His shadow. This is a bold statement of what God wants to do for us.

We can receive anything God has already provided. The secret is knowing that everything for which God has made provision is clearly spelled out and defined in the Word of God. His provision is already there waiting to be received.

Know for a fact that God is faithful to all the promises He has made. He didn't create man and then leave man to himself. When God created us He automatically made Himself responsible to care for us and meet our every need. And when God makes a promise, He is faithful to what He has promised. This psalm builds from one promise to the next. Men are judged by their faithfulness to their own word. Real men are only as good as their word. God is far and away more faithful than even the most truthful man, because God has the power to carry out His Word.

Faith is not a tool to manipulate God into giving you something you want. Faith is simply the means by which we accept what God has already made available. Our goal needs to be the renewal of our minds, to such an extent that we have more faith in God's Word than in what we can perceive with our physical senses. God does not make promises that are out of our reach!

In the book of Romans, the Apostle Paul wrote:

"What then! If some did not believe, their unbelief will not nullify the faithfulness of God, will it? May it never be! Rather, let God be found true, though every man be found a liar, as it is written. That you may be justified in your words, and prevail when you are judged". (Romans 3:3-4)

Even though there may be some who don't believe, their unbelief will never nullify God's promises to the ones who do believe.

Without the promises of protection throughout the Word of God, and especially without our Psalm 91 covenant – listing all forms of protection made available in one psalm – we might feel kind of presumptuous if, on our own, we asked God to protect us from all the things listed in these verses.

In fact, we probably would not have the nerve to ask Him for all of this coverage. BUT...God offered this protection to us before we even had a chance to ask.

Just something to think about.

This is a huge step toward having a Post Home. Once the lease is signed we can actively solicit for grants to help us build our Post Home.

A huge thank you to Loren, Pedro and a number of other members who tirelessly petitioned the city for an agreement; your efforts have not gone unnoticed!

Post Service Officer

An American Legion Post Service Officer (PSO) cannot file a claim, fill out a claim, review a current claim or represent a veteran with the VA unless they are accredited by the VA. Attending the American Legion PSO course does not certify or accredit a PSO to represent a veteran.

An American Legion PSO has a wealth of information. They can help a veteran find resources to assist them in whatever endeavor they are trying to accomplish. They can provide information concerning benefits, programs, and resources that may assist our veterans to survive a crisis, get VA assistance, and/or provide options for the veteran to consider. Once the veteran has spoken with the PSO and the veteran determines that they would like to proceed, the PSO can and will provide the points of contact for the program, person, or organization that can help the veteran. A PSO's greatest weapon is information and they have a ton of it!

The main office for the Volusia County Service Officer was moved to 211 Rich Ave in DeLand and the Deltona office is located at the Deltona Regional Library at 2150 Eustace Ave. The hours are Mon—Fri 8am to 5pm. 386-775-5205.

Veteran suicides are at epidemic proportions. Below is a suicide prevention number available if a veteran is struggling and finds themselves in that dark place. We cannot afford to allow a veteran in crisis to go by the wayside. Never leave a man or woman behind!

Free Daytona Clinic For Low-Income, No-Health-Insurance Patients Has Moved

The Volusia Free Clinic, a volunteer-based community health center, has moved to a new location and is seeing low-income Volusia County patients who have no health insurance. The new location is 1901 Mason Ave, in Daytona Beach, Suite 110.

The new office is in Daytona Beach, and will give the clinic an opportunity to serve more patients, said Dr. Sam Cay, vice president of the Volusia Volunteers in Medicine, Inc., board.

Cay said the move was made possible in part by donations of money, medical equipment and office furnishings.

Volusia Free Clinic operates with volunteers and is looking for more help from medical providers, he said.

Typically, the clinic sees patients with arthritis, breathing problems, diabetes, heart disease and elevated cholesterol. Appointments must be made in advance. In addition to the website, people can call 386-316-2771.

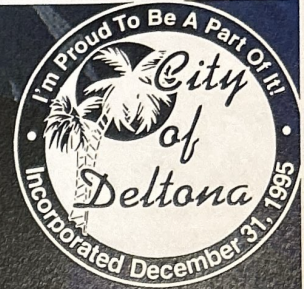

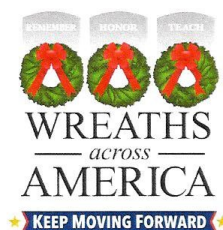
